Aims and objectives of this workshop:

- For participants to be able to calculate statutory gender pay gaps returns confidently.
- To understand the similarities and differences in calculating pay gaps for other protected characteristics.
- To interpret and benchmark statistics after calculation.

What participants will 'take away' after the workshop:

Participants will gain a good understanding of how to complete the UK government's

statutory gender pay gap return and the common pitfalls affecting HEIs. Only HEIs in England are required to complete this by law but HEIs in other nations may wish to report this voluntarily. Additionally, they will have explored how to extend the statutory requirements to consider pay gaps using an intersectional framework. Finally, they will be able to benchmark their HEI to the wider HE sector and also the wider economy and understand factors to consider when writing their supporting narratives for their submission and local communications.

Introduction to workplace investigator skills workshop – Thursday 22 June



The Introduction to workplace investigator skills workshop is a practical one-day online workshop for potential investigators who would like an insight into what conducting an investigation entails. It includes the legal and procedural framework, an opportunity to practice the skills in a role-play situation, and to discuss any concerns or queries. The workshop starts from the point where someone has been selected as an appropriate investigator by HR and any pre-investigation work has already been conducted. It concludes at the point where the appointed investigator hands over the written report to HR. The workshop will cover the basic principles and skills, and provides an opportunity to practice these. It is not a certificated training course, nor will it be suitable for participants who will be conducting more complex investigations, nor for investigations that require a trauma-based approach. It may however be helpful as a refresher for those who have conducted investigations in the past and would like a recap on the basic processes and skills, as well as those who are new investigators. By the end of the workshop participants will understand how the investigation fits into the disciplinary and grievance framework and:

- Become familiar with Dignity at Work/ED&I grievance and disciplinary issues
- Understand what constitutes an effective and rigorous investigation
- Appreciate the core skills to conduct a robust, fair and impartial process
- Understand what establishes evidence; how to analyse and assess it
- Understand the basis of making good judgements in a fair,

proportionate and impartial manner

Appreciate what constitutes a good report.

Please note that this workshop covers the *investigation* process and the required skills rather than the setting-up of panels or the hearing itself.

Course content and materials

The course is designed for online delivery. Activities will provide the opportunity to engage in small group work and plenary discussions and will include written or practical exercises, short videos and skills practice. The workshop will also offer an excellent opportunity to discuss issues with fellow participants.

Breaks will be timed to reflect the virtual environment and delegates will be able to move away from their screen at least every 60-75 minutes between activities or during activities.

- <u>Pre-reading is required</u>; we recommend the participants familiarise themselves with their own organisations' grievance, disciplinary, Dignity at Work/ED&I policies.
- A delegate pack will be sent to booked participants around 10 days prior to the course to supplement the learning. This will include topics such as interview structuring, questioning technique, effective report writing and tips on note taking.
- Participants will need to spend 60 90 minutes on this pre-reading ahead of the course.
- This course and the materials provided will be focused on the higher education sector. However, it does not cover sexual misconduct or sexual violence cases in detail.

Participant numbers are strictly limited to 12.

Timings and booking

The workshop takes place between **9.30 am** and **4.30 pm** on **Thursday 22 June**. Participants will need to attend the whole day to benefit fully from the course.

The cost of the workshop is £425 per place.

A reminder of some of the UCEA services and materials we have provided to members since the start of February (the date of our previous Bulletin). From Updates to events, this is just a handful of the highlights...

- UCEA's 2023-24 New JNCHES pay round web pages are being updated regularly as this
 round progresses. The feedback on the Acas facilitated talks and the terms of reference
 (ToRs) for Phase two of the round have been recently added.
- Linked to this, our news releases pages are regularly updated, in response to IA and the pay negotiations. At the time of the Bulletin 'going to print' the focus was on Phase two of the 2023-24 pay round. UCEA's communications briefings regarding the pay talks are hosted in the Member Briefings section of the website which are written to assist members' communications. Our most recent briefings on implementing the pay uplift and around the ToRs on the non-pay items were added in February and March respectively. UCEA members espouse the need for a proactive and positive approach to communicating the highly valuable total reward package provided to staff in HE. The communications of positive messages relating to pay and non-pay issues is a task for both UCEA and participating HEIs.
- Members are reminded to use UCEA events page to find details of all our events. Upcoming
 events include HE pensions 2023 and beyond the annual UCEA pensions conference which
 will take place on 16 May 2023 at Woburn House, London. This is a great opportunity to
 hear from all the sector's main pension schemes and network with pensions colleagues.

Further to Update 23:002, UCEA received 45 responses to our request for feedback from members on the government's consultation which closed on 9 March 2023. The consultation invited views on the Westminster Government's proposals to introduce a holiday entitlement reference period for 'part-year' and 'irregular' workers, to ensure that their holiday pay and entitlement is directly proportionate to the time they spend working, and not greater than part-time workers who work the same total number of hours across the year (a consequence of the Supreme Court's judgement on Harpur Trust v Brazel in July 2022). We submitted a sector response which is now available on our website.

Based on members' views, UCEA confirmed that the government's proposal to simplify the calculation of the holiday entitlement that these workers are entitled to is generally welcomed by the sector. The Harper v Brazel ruling created a disparity between workers, additional costs and administrative complexities for employers. Having given careful consideration to the full range of proposals detailed in this consultation, and based on the views we received, UCEA put forward a request for the government to consider allowing employers to use the 'percentage method', as suggested for agency workers, for all part-year and irregular workers. We noted that in the HE sector, the 'percentage method' whereby holiday entitlement is calculated as a percentage of hours worked during a defined period has generally been used and preferred (in line with Acas guidance prior to the Harper v Brazel case). This is due to the large variety of mutually beneficial 'atypical' contract types and working arrangements that exist for education delivery - it is seen as the easiest way to administer holiday entitlement, whilst being an effective way of ensuring parity across the organisation.

We will update members on the outcome of the government's consultation, when available.

UCEA Charter Matrix

Members are reminded that UCEA has developed a matrix of over 40 employment charters in response to the growing number of charters and pledges that are available to employers (Charter Matrix). The schemes provide public recognition of 'good employment' practices over the whole employee journey and are mapped to show where they overlap in terms of subject matter and processes to commit to them. The various initiatives are categorised into the overarching themes of Equality and Diversity, Health and Wellbeing, Family and General Employment.

UCEA has recently updated the Charter Matrix (Family and Equality and Diversity themes) to include:

- · The Fertility Workplace Pledge; and
- The Emily Test Charter

The Fertility Workplace Pledge has been launched by Nickie Aiken, Member of Parliament for the Cities of London and Westminster, and has four main elements to it:

- Ensuring there is an accessible workplace fertility policy,
- establishing the role of Fertility Ambassador to raise awareness in the workplace,
- · staff training,

 and giving employees the right to request flexible working to attend appointments related to their fertility treatment.

UCEA is aware that a number of private sector organisations have committed to the pledge, but we would be interested to know if any HEIs have done so – if your HEI has signed the pledge, please contact Senior Employment Policy Adviser.

A private members' bill – the Fertility Treatment (Employment Rights) Bill – has been introduced in Parliament, alongside the launch of the Pledge. If passed into law, the Bill would give employees a statutory right to take time off work to attend fertility treatment clinic appointments, in a similar way to antenatal appointments. An employee would have the right not to be subjected to any detriment by any act, or any deliberate failure to act, by their employer in connection with their right to take time off work to attend fertility treatment appointments. The second reading of the Bill is due to take place on 24 November 2023.

The Emily Test Charter was launched in 2021 and is a Gender-Based Violence (GBV) Charter for colleges and universities. Emily Test is a Scottish Government-funded charity in Scotland working to improve gender-based violence (GBV) prevention, intervention and support in further and higher education in Scotland. It was set up in 2016 following the death of undergraduate student, Emily Drouet, after she was subjected to a campaign of GBV from a fellow student. The 'test' the charter refers to requires minimum standards (based on a set of principles) to be met, and can be summarised as: Would your institution have saved Emily's life? There are currently 13 educational institutions across Scotland that are engaged with the charter, including a number of HEIs, and we understand that it may be extended to other UK educational institutions in the near future.

HEIs may also find the Equally Safe in Higher Education Toolkit useful. This is a free resource created for Scottish universities at the University of Strathclyde by the ESHE Project team, providing a practical collection of free materials and resources for Scottish HEIs working to prevent gender-based violence (GBV) on their campuses. Although the Toolkit specifically reflects on and references Scottish government policy, the materials may also be useful to HEIs in other nations when developing their approach or policy in this area.

Annual increase to employment tribunal compensation from 6 April 2023 Employment Tribunal Limits

The Employment Rights (Increase of Limits) Order 2023 has been published, setting out the new limits and caps to be applied in Employment Tribunal remedies. These apply where the event giving rise to the claim, such as the termination of employment, occurs on or after 6 April 2023.

The key increases include:

- The cap on a week's pay for the purposes of calculating both the basic award in unfair dismissal cases and statutory redundancy payments will be increased from £571 to £643.
 This means that the maximum basic award for unfair dismissal and the maximum statutory redundancy payment will increase from £17,130 to £19,290;
- The minimum basic award for unfair dismissal in health and safety, employee representative, trade union and occupational pension trustee cases will increase from £6,959 to £7,836;
- The maximum compensatory award for unfair dismissal will rise from £93,878 to £105,707 (in each case, the maximum award would be one year's gross pay if this is lower than these figures). The cap on compensation does not apply to certain dismissals (including those arising due to unlawful discrimination or whistleblowing).

Discrimination Compensation

The annual updates to the Vento guidelines (which give ranges for injury to feelings awards in discrimination cases, depending on severity) have been published. In respect of claims presented on or after 6 April 2023, the Vento bands are:

- a lower band of £1,100 to £11,200 (less serious cases);
- a middle band of £11,200 to £33,700 (cases that do not merit an award in the upper band);
 and.
- an upper band of £33,700 to £56,200 (the most serious cases), with the most exceptional cases capable of exceeding £56,200.

Gender pay gap reporting

The Westminster Government has published updated statutory guidance on gender pay gap (GPG) reporting. GPG reporting has been a statutory requirement since 2017 under which public and private sector organisations in England, Scotland and Wales with 250 or more employees must carry out and report various calculations on a specific 'snapshot' date each year designed to track their organisation's gender pay gap over time.

The snapshot dates are:

- 31 March for most public authority employers
- 5 April for private, voluntary and all other public authority employers.

The guidance does not apply to Scottish or Welsh public authorities - there are different regulations for Scotland and Wales. The provisions also do not apply to Northern Ireland as yet.

There have been no changes to the factual content of the guidance and the way organisations work out and report their GPG information is the same, but the format of the guidance has been updated to:

- make it clearer and simpler;
- · locate it in one place on GOV.UK; and,
- remove any unnecessary duplication and repetition.

UCEA has published a range of resources for members on the GPG available on the Equality and Pay Gaps section of UCEA's website. The resources include regularly updated infographics Examining the GPG in HE. UCEA has also published a report on Intersectional Pay Gaps in Higher Education. This is the second edition of this report and compares gender, ethnicity and intersectional pay gaps across the sector for all six reporting metrics. Participating HEIs also receive access to the UCEA Pay Gaps Dashboard which can be used for interactive benchmarking across different groups of HEIs.

The CIPD have also published a Gender pay gap reporting guide to help employers comply with the reporting requirements and address their GPGs.

Government response to the Women and Equalities Committee's report – Menopause and the workplace

On 24 January, the Westminster Government published its response to the Women and Equalities Committee's report - "Menopause and the workplace". While some of the recommendations made in the report were accepted, either in full or in part, several key recommendations were not. These included making the menopause a protected characteristic under the Equality Act 2010, and enacting Section 14 of the Equality Act, which outlaws less favourable treatment because of a combination of two relevant protected characteristics. The recommendations to pilot a policy for menopause leave with a large public sector employer and the production of model menopause policies were also rejected.

However, the government is developing 'strengthened guidance' that will give 'a set of clear and simple principles' that employers would be expected to apply to support disabled people and those with long term health conditions at work. The government states these could also apply where workers are experiencing symptoms such as those that occur in the menopause.

The government also accepted the Committee's recommendation to make flexible working a 'day one' right, which had already been accepted following the government's Consultation on Making Flexible Working the Default and legislation is currently making its way through Parliamentary approval.

The government also accepted the Committee's recommendation to appoint a "menopause employment champion" to work alongside stakeholders from business, unions and advisory groups, whose role will be to 'give a voice to menopausal women, promoting their economic contribution, and working with employers to keep people experiencing menopause symptoms in work and progressing'. On 6 March, Helen Tomlinson, Head of Talent (UK & Ireland) at The Adecco Group was appointed by the government as the first Menopause Employment Champion. The role will focus on encouraging employers to develop menopause policies that create more supportive environments.

April is Stress Awareness Month. Understanding GDP, economic growth and 'technical recessions'

In its Economic and fiscal outlook published on the same day at the Spring Budget, the Office for Budget Responsibility (OBR) forecasted that the UK will not enter a technical recession in 2023. An episode of the Office of National Statistics' (ONS) Statistically Speaking podcast discusses the definition of a recession, explaining how the ONS calculates GDP, and describes other measures relevant to economic wellbeing.

While a technical recession is widely regarded as 'two consecutive quarters of negative growth', Darren Morgan, ONS Director of Economic Statistics, discusses in the podcast how best to interpret small changes in economic growth. He gives an overview of how GDP is calculated, in a timely and comprehensive manner. As well as covering manufacturing, earnings and public spending, GDP considers changes in the use of public services such as education and healthcare. The ONS estimates GDP by surveying thousands of households and businesses and revises GDP over time as more economic data becomes available. Given the numerous factors that feed into GDP and that revisions can happen, Morgan describes recent trends in economic growth as being 'broadly flat' and that differences between small percentages of growth and contraction can be overinterpreted.

The ONS Chief Economist, Grant Fitzner, then provides a history of the term 'recession' and discusses how it is typically used. Looking at the early 1980s recession and the 2008 financial crisis, he defines a recession as 'a prolonged and significant downturn in economic activity'. These previous recessions should be contrasted with the current economic trend. Fitzner sees previous downturns as more substantial than the current trend since they were "... not just one or two quarters, and not just a 0.1% change". Other economic measures beyond GDP should be taken into

account when considering whether an economy is in recession, such as business liquidations, retail spending and unemployment rates.

The podcast also discusses the shortcomings of GDP as a statistic, with Fitzner highlighting that it does not necessarily capture quality of life, economic wellbeing, or environmental factors. Liz McKeown, the ONS Director of Public Policy Analysis, reports on the ONS's latest work on quality of life in the UK. Data on wellbeing, education and skills, interpersonal relationships, finance, health and the environment are now reported alongside quarterly estimates of GDP.

Salary Survey of Higher Education Staff

The UCEA / XpertHR Salary Survey of Higher Education Staff (SSHES) 2023 is currently in field. The survey covers salaries of all staff below Professor level or professional services equivalent. This survey, along with the Senior Staff Remuneration Survey, represents the largest pay benchmarking resources in the sector with last year's survey reporting employee pay data for 293,419 individuals from 110 institutions. XpertHR undertakes the data collection and survey analysis on behalf of UCEA.

There is **still time** to take part and the deadline for submitting completed survey forms is **Friday 28 May 2023**. Access to the pay benchmarking data is for participating institutions only at a cost of £910 plus VAT.

Pensions in HE

UCEA pensions newsletter

In March we published edition 31 of our pensions newsletter. This latest edition looked at the estimated cost pension tax relief system, it's flaws and the likelihood or not of any reforms to simplify the system. The newsletter also provided updates on the main HE sector schemes and confirmed that UCEA's annual pensions conference, HE pensions 2023 and beyond, will take place on 16 May 2023.

Government confirms auto enrolment extensions

The Westminster Government has recently confirmed its support for a new Private Members Bill on reforms to Automatic Enrolment (AE). The bills proposes;

- A reduction in the lower age limit from (currently age 22) which the employer duty to autoenrol applies – but with regulations now able to set this lower age. The policy intent is to reduce the lower age limit to 18.
- The potential removal of the lower limit of the qualifying earnings band (currently £6,240 p.a.) within which minimum AE contributions are determined, so that contributions are calculated on all earnings up to the upper limit of the band (currently £50,270 p.a.).
 Regulations are able to deliver on the detail which could allow for the lower limit to be reduced for a period of time ahead of its potential removal.

The expectation is that the provisions in this Bill will not result in any immediate change but will give the Secretary of State powers to amend the age limit and lower earnings limit for AE. There will be a statutory requirement to consult before using these powers and the government has recently stated that it hopes to issue its consultation in the autumn assuming the Bill is finalised over the coming weeks.

Judicial review on McCloud remedy cost dismissed

A judicial review on the Westminster Government's proposed method of paying for costs incurred by the McCloud judgment has been dismissed by the High Court.

The Fire Brigade Union (FBU) brought a claim for judicial review challenging the Westminster Government for failing to lift the pause on the operation of the cost control mechanism in the public service schemes and failing to implement benefit improvements that it said should have been made following the 2016 valuations of schemes including the TPS and NHSPS.

However, the case was dismissed after the Judge, Justice Choudhury, who concluded that the legal bases on which the unions claims was brought were not made out. The judge also stated that the wording of the Public Service Pensions Act is wide enough to allow directions to be made passing on the McCloud cost to members.

'What you may have missed since our last Bulletin...'

UCEA's most intense challenges over the past year have related to pay negotiations and industrial relations and action. We have continued to prioritise our effort and resources to support those areas of work where our members have the greatest need and industrial action has been central to this. But this has been alongside our other work supporting members and delivering the priorities in UCEA's Strategic Plan and the difficult challenges faced have not distracted from these important provisions.

In April 2021 we published **Agility in a time of uncertainty**, which set out what we would deliver for our members over the first 30 months. This is now extended until the end of the 2023-24 academic year.

This is a reminder of some of the UCEA services and materials we have provided to members since the start of June (the date of our previous Bulletin). From Updates to communications materials, here is just a handful of the reminder highlights...

- UCEA's Annual Members' Event took place on Monday 3 July at the New Connaught Rooms
 in central London. Despite the HE industrial action and strike action in the rail sector, we
 were very pleased to welcome over 70 guests to hear an update on UCEA's work from our
 Chief Executive Raj Jethwa and important presentations from David D'Souza, Director of
 Membership at the CIPD, Professor Liz Bacon, Principal and Vice-Chancellor at Abertay
 University and Sharron Pamplin, Chief People Officer at Lloyd's Register on AI, Digital
 Transformation and the workforce implications. The meeting was hosted by our Chair,
 Professor George Boyne who managed the audience discussions and debate.

 year. Over the summer, we are running three of our popular online courses and a limited

 book places. The September run of our Total Reward: from intention to experience,
 policies to practice is now fully booked, a new date will be confirmed shortly.
- Since the June bulletin the Employment Policy and Advice Team has published Updates on the following: the July Immigration Rules changes, the Westminster Government's response to its consultation on parental leave and pay, the response from Universities UK/UCEA to the Migration Advisory Committee shortage occupation list call for evidence and dental trainees at Specialty Trainee stages 4 and 5 in England.
- A number of in-person UCEA membership visits have also been taking place. We gather so
 much from meeting members and while it understandable that we can only visit a small
 number each year please do contact Andy Fryer if you are interested in a visit.

UCEA triennial membership survey

In the June Bulletin we thanked our readers for the high engagement levels and explained that the triennial UCEA membership survey, running across four exceptionally busy and challenging weeks for the sector during April and May, had also achieved good initial feedback. We are grateful to members for the highest response rate we have ever achieved for this survey, despite the understandable pressures on members.

On 20 July we emailed UCEA's triennial Member Satisfaction Survey 2022-23 – Summary of findings to Heads of Institution and HR Directors as they are the ones that took part. This survey assesses members' satisfaction with UCEA's range and quality of our services, gaining valuable feedback on key aspects of our work and we are delighted to report that it provided extremely positive responses.

The overall feedback includes 87% of members being 'satisfied' or 'very satisfied' with UCEA's services and 81% of members 'agreeing' or 'agreeing strongly' that UCEA's services and support provide good value for money. In 'Representing members and their interests' 94% of members rated the usefulness of UCEA's information in supporting organisations' employment and workforce strategy as 'useful' or 'very useful'. In 'Industrial action information and advice' of HR Directors said that UCEA is 'effective' or 'very effective' at providing relevant information and advice on industrial action.

The survey also included new sections to ask members about our prioritised areas of work. We note that the least high scoring areas, including employee experience, are within our new strands of work. Here 67% of HR Directors agreed that the employee experience resources provided by UCEA are 'useful' or 'very useful'. But the reason for this suggests that, with a quarter of respondents expressing impartiality, members have not yet accessed the outputs from this important new work on Total reward and the Employee value proposition. UCEA's strategy supports employer aspirations to enhance the employee experience as a key pillar, which we believe will help progress our work relating to our first strategic priority on promoting constructive employment relations.

Employment policy

Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Act 2023

The Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Act 2023 (the Act) became law in May 2023 and will be regulated by the Office for Students (OfS). The Westminster Government has indicated that it expects the new duties in the Act to come into force before the 2024-25 academic year. The OfS will publish formal guidance on meeting the requirements pf the Act following consultation with the sector. Under the Act a new OfS role of Director for Freedom of Speech and Academic Freedom has been introduced and sits on the OfS Board. Professor Arif Ahmed has been appointed to the role.

The new Act applies to higher education institutions (HEIs) in England. The provisions for freedom of speech set out in part IV of the Education (No.2) Act 1986 will continue to apply for Welsh HEIs. In Scotland the provision for upholding academic freedom is set out in the Higher Education Governance (Scotland) Act 2016. UCEA will update members on the relevant provisions for freedom of speech in Northern Ireland and Scotland in due course.

The main purpose of the Act is to ensure HEIs comply with enhanced free speech duties or face sanctions from the OfS and/or legal claims from individuals. There is a new strengthened duty to secure and promote the importance of freedom of speech within the law and academic freedom. HEIs are required to take steps that are "reasonably practicable" to achieve those objectives. The duty to protect academic freedom is extended explicitly to academic staff, and HEIs are required not to reduce the likelihood of academic staff securing promotion or different jobs at the provider, on the grounds of said staff exercising their rights to academic freedom. The duty also applies to the recruitment of individuals who are applying for jobs as academic staff at a particular HEI, who may have exercised their rights to academic freedom elsewhere.

Other duties/changes under the Act include:

- The OfS will develop new conditions of registration relating to freedom of speech (within the law) and academic freedom which will require HEIs to comply with the new duties under the Act.
- HEIs are required to strengthen their codes of practice on free speech and academic freedom
- Student unions (SUs) have a strengthened duty to promote the importance of freedom of speech and academic freedom and to develop and maintain a code of practice.
- Individuals can bring civil claims against an HEI or SU if they consider the HEI or SU has breached their freedom of speech and/or academic freedom duties and this has caused the individual to sustain a loss.
- A free speech complaints scheme has been introduced for individuals to make a complaint
 if they have suffered adverse consequences a result of action or inaction by an HEI or SU.
 The scheme is free to use and will be run by the OfS.
- Under the Act the OfS will monitor overseas funding of HEIs and SUs to assess the extent to which the funding presents a risk to freedom of speech and academic freedom.
- The use of non-disclosure agreements (NDAs) is prohibited in complaints relating to bullying, harassment and sexual misconduct.

With regard to NDAs, members will recall that the OfS included a proposal to prohibit NDAs in their **consultation** on harassment and sexual misconduct including prohibiting the enforcement of previously agreed NDAs. The OfS is yet to publish its response to their consultation.

Universities UUK (UUK) has established an Advisory Group to develop a briefing on the new Act for HEIs for circulation at the start of the autumn term on the new Act for HEIs. UCEA is a member of the Group.

Tackling racial harassment report

UUK have published an updated report, **Tackling racial harassment: progress since 2020**. The report reflects on the progress made by the sector in tackling racial harassment since UUK's original guidance, **Tackling racial harassment in higher education** was published in November 2020. The report identifies practical suggestions for further progress in this area and sets out the findings of a survey of UUK members, focus groups with staff and students and results of student polling. The publication also includes a set of case studies from HEIs on their work to tackle racial harassment.

Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) guide

The ICO has published question and answer (Q and A) guidance for employers on subject access requests (SARs). The Q and As provide helpful clarification for employers on their obligations and the rights of individuals under data protection and answers some key questions using examples, including the right of access, whether individuals have to submit the request in a certain format, and whether employers can clarify the SAR requests.

High Court finds that regulations allowing the use of agency workers during strike action are unlawful

On 13 July 2023, the High Court upheld the judicial review challenge by 13 trade unions and quashed the Conduct of Employment Agencies and Employment Businesses (Amendment) Regulations 2022 (the Regulations). The Regulations changed the law from 21 July 2022 to remove the ban on the supply of agency workers to carry out the duties of a striking worker.

The change to the regulations will now be quashed with effect from 10 August 2023 and employers will no longer be permitted to hire temporary agency staff to cover the work of employees who are taking part in industrial action, or indeed the work of employees who have been temporarily moved by the employer to cover the employees taking part in official industrial action. While it is possible that the government may appeal this decision, even if they do so, the Quashing Order will take effect on 10 August 2023 and remain in place until any appeal is decided or the government attempts to reintroduce the regulations after a new consultation process. As a consequence, HEIs that are using agency workers to backfill striking workers, or workers moved internally to backfill striking workers should take steps that are necessary to end such arrangements before 10 August 2023, and may wish to consider making alternative arrangements, for example the use of their own existing in-house banks (not agency workers). UCEA is in the process of reviewing our guidance on Industrial Action in this area.

Supporting employees with fertility challenges

The Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development (CIPD) has published a practical guide for employers on supporting employees experiencing fertility issues: People manager guide: Fertility challenges, investigations or treatment. It highlights fertility issues as an important area of wellbeing in the workplace, affecting men as well as women, as the partner of someone experiencing fertility challenges is also likely to need support. The guide identifies the following good practice principles when offering support in the workplace:

- Raise awareness of the need to recognise pregnancy or baby loss as part of workplace wellbeing in a sensitive manner.
- Cultivate an open, inclusive and supportive culture that breaks down stigma and assures employees they will receive adequate support.
- Develop an organisational framework that includes specific policies to address issues surrounding pregnancy and baby loss.
- Manage absences and leave with compassion and flexibility.

 Equip line managers with the necessary skills to provide empathetic and understanding support to employees, enabling them to have sensitive conversations with their team members.

Members may find the guide helpful when considering the potential implications of the Fertility Treatment (Employment Rights) Bill, as outlined in the UCEA Employment Bulletin in April 2023. The Bill is still making its way through Parliament, with the second reading due to take place on 24 November 2023. The Employment Statutory Code of Practice published by the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) includes a section on 'Absences related to in vitro fertilisation' which states that it is good practice for employers to treat any request for time off for IVF or other fertility treatment sympathetically and consider adopting a procedure to cover this situation. It also outlines the current legal position: in responding to requests for time off from a woman undergoing IVF, an employer must not treat her less favourably than they treat, or would treat, a man in a similar situation as this could amount to sex discrimination. After a fertilised embryo has been implanted, a woman is legally pregnant and from that point is protected from unfavourable treatment because of her pregnancy, including pregnancy-related sickness. She would also be entitled to time off for antenatal care. Members may also find The Fertility Workplace Pledge of interest, the key aspects of which are summarised in UCEA's Charter Matrix (Family and Equality and Diversity themes).

Right to request predictable terms and conditions of work

The Workers (Predictable Terms and Conditions) Bill, if passed, will introduce a statutory right for workers and agency workers to request predictable terms and conditions of work. The Bill follows the Good Work Plan's proposal for a right for workers to request a more predictable and stable contract after 26 weeks' service. It is currently progressing through the various parliamentary stages and had its second reading in the House of Lords on 16 June. It is likely that it will take effect in early 2024. UCEA will update members on this legislation in due course.

New flexible working measures

The Employment Relations (Flexible Working) Bill was given Royal Assent, and passed as law on 20 July. It will be known as the **Employment Relations** (**Flexible Working**) Act 2023. The Act makes changes to the current rights of employees to request a flexible working amendment to their contracts of employment. Workers will benefit from the following new protections once in force:

- New requirements for employers to consult with the employee before rejecting their flexible working request.
- Permission to make two statutory requests in any 12-month period (rather than the current one request).
- Reduced waiting times for decisions to be made (within which an employer administers the statutory request) from three months to two months.
- The removal of existing requirements that the employee must explain what effect, if any, the change applied for would have on the employer and how that effect might be dealt with.

The measures in the Act and secondary legislation are expected to come into force approximately a year after Royal Assent, to give employers time to prepare for the changes, and the measures will be supported by a **Statutory Code of Practice on handling requests for flexible working**. This Code is being developed by Acas and is currently under consultation with a deadline of 6 September 2023. The aim of the Code is to provide a clear explanation of the law on the statutory right to request flexible working, and good practice advice on handling requests in a reasonable manner. UCEA will be providing further details on the new Act and seeking members' views on the Acas consultation shortly.

Research

UK inflation falls in June

On 19 July 2023, the ONS published its latest figures for inflation in the UK. The annual rate of CPIH (Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs) rose 7.3% in the 12 months to June 2023, down from 7.9% in May. The annual rate of CPI for June was 7.9% while the annual rate for RPI (Retail Prices Index) for June was 10.7%. The annual rate of CPIH peaked in October 2022 at 9.6% and the current rate is the lowest since April 2022. The decline in inflation is linked with a reduction in the costs of transport and of food and drink. Prices associated with transport fell by 1.7% in the year to June 2023, with motor fuel falling by 22.7%. May and June 2023 also showed a slowing of the increase to food and drink prices with these increasing by 0.4% in comparison to the 1.2% increase for May and June 2022. The decrease in CPIH can also be attributed, to a lesser extent, to changes in the prices of furniture and household goods and of eating at restaurants and staying in hotels.

The ONS also publish **insights regarding the cost of living** which combines economic data with qualitative information on public opinion and social trends. This resource serves to explain trends within inflation and the pressures that this puts on UK households. The shopping prices comparison tool and personal inflation calculator allow users to better understand how inflation affects them and their daily purchases. Analyses of footfall in commercial sectors and sales data are tied closely to public opinion on spending habits and consumption, with three fifths (63%) of respondents reporting that they are spending less on non-essentials. The continued increases in household energy costs mean that nearly half (47%) of adults are using less fuel in the household. Since the cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages has risen by 17.4% between June 2022 and June 2023, almost half of respondents (48%) stated that they were buying less in their food shop.

Pensions in HE

UCEA pensions newsletter

In July we published edition 33 of our pensions newsletter. This latest edition looked at the potential impact Artificial Intelligence could have on the pensions industry, considered the latest gender pension gap statistics and provided updates on the main HE pension schemes.

We also reminded HEIs about the HE Pension Managers group we have set up utilising the JISCmail system. Members of the HEPM group can raise questions and seek information and guidance in a confidential space directly from other pensions colleagues from across the HE sector using JISCmail.

In addition, we have also held three quarterly online meetings of the HEPM group to discuss in more detail the key issues affecting HE pension provision. The next meeting of the group will be held in September 2023. An invite will be sent via the JISCmail list in the coming weeks.

If you or a colleague have not already joined the HEPM group, please email Please note that we have limited participation to two individuals per institution.

New BUFDG guidance on pensions for overseas staff

UCEA recently took part in a working group convened by BUFDG to assist in drafting their guidance on the tax and social security implications of providing USS to staff working overseas. The guidance, produced by Vialto Partners, has now been published and is available through the BUFDG website (login required) - BUFDG - USS Overseas Members Country Grid. The initial guidance focusses on the ten countries which have the highest population of overseas academics. If you don't have access to the BUFDG website, please contact them directly.

Along with UCEA's Employing HE staff overseas updated toolkit and Working remotely from overseas decision map, which highlights key issues and areas of risk for employers to consider

when deciding whether to allow staff to work from overseas, we hope these resources provide a useful starting point for HEIs dealing with these complex issues.

Chancellor's Mansion House speech

On 10 July 2023, during his "Mansion House" speech, the Chancellor announced a number of proposed pension reforms intended to boost pensions savings, increase investment in UK businesses and grow the UK economy.

To accompany the speech, the government issued several new consultations and calls for evidence;

- a DWP consultation on a policy framework to support individuals in DC decumulation.
- a DWP consultation on "ending the proliferation of deferred small pots" proposing establishing a system of multiple default consolidators.
- a DWP call for evidence on DB scheme surplus, consolidation, asset allocation and incentives around investment strategies, along with a separate response to the DWP's 2018/19 consultation on consolidation of DB schemes, and
- a joint HMT and DWP call for evidence on pension trustee skills, capability and culture.

Should your HEI wish to submit evidence, each of these consultations will close on 5 September 2023.

The following government papers were also published in July:

- a response to the joint January 2023 consultation on a value for money framework, announcing that the parties intend to move forward with their proposals. This will require legislative changes to be carried out "when parliamentary time allows", and future consultations on draft regulations and FCA rules, and
- a DWP response to the January 2023 consultation on extending opportunities for CDC schemes. The DWP intends to move forward with its proposals, and a consultation on draft regulations to enable unconnected multi-employer CDC schemes is planned for autumn 2023.

Responses were also published to a number of previous consultations including the new Value for Money Framework, DB consolidation and extending opportunities for collective defined contribution schemes.

There is also confirmation of a commitment from nine of the biggest DC providers to sign up to the "Mansion House Compact" to voluntarily earmark 5% of their default fund assets to private equity investments by 2030. Initial participants are Aviva, Scottish Widows, L&G, Aegon, Phoenix, Nest, Smart Pension, M&G and Mercer.

We will provide more detail on the "Mansion House" pension reforms in the September edition of the UCEA Pensions Newsletter.

UCEA triennial membership survey

Thank you

We would like to say a big 'thank you'. The triennial UCEA membership survey, conducted by DJS Research, ran across four exceptionally busy and challenging weeks for the sector during April and May. We chose to run the survey, despite the UCU strike action, to remain within the three academic years since the previous (2019-20) survey. Of course, the primary aim is to assess your satisfaction with the range of services we currently provide and gain valuable feedback on specific aspects of our work. A further aim is to gather members' reflections on what they might want to see UCEA develop.

For an online survey, DJS described the response rate from our 173 member organisations as 'excellent' with half of HR Directors (86) and an unprecedented 70 Heads of Institution taking part. For context, 80 HR Directors and 46 Heads of Institution completed the 2019 survey. So again, 'thank you'.

Results and comparisons

At the time of writing, we have not yet received the full findings from DJS, although they have provided a reassuring piece of intel for Bulletin readers; that membership satisfaction was looking 'positive'!

While it was difficult for the 2023 questions to mirror exactly those in 2019, 2016 and 2013 we will work to produce comparisons. These included some survey questions that fell under subheadings relating to UCEA's general membership provisions and effectiveness, value for money as a UCEA subscriber as well as members' satisfaction levels and perceptions of UCEA.

The report for members will be 'coming soon' but thanks again and please get in contact with for any immediate queries.

The outcome of the National Conversation on Pay Bargaining consultation In early May we wrote to all Heads of Institution and HR Directors to say thank you for taking the time to respond to our written consultation, Adapting for sustainability, the culmination of our National Conversation on Pay Bargaining (NCPB). We also included a presentation of the consultation findings which we had previously presented over 100 senior HR colleagues.

In summary, 95 HEIs responded, representing two-thirds of those HEIs that take part in collective bargaining expressing overwhelming support of collective pay bargaining and UCEA's role as their representative.

UCEA's recommendation in the consultation, based on 18 months of engagement, was to 'adapt' (rather than 'stick' or 'replace') our approach to pay negotiations within the current structure. This approach was supported by of two-third of respondents. We will now develop an approach to negotiations based on this response from the sector. In practice this will involve providing greater leadership over developing the mandate, which was trialled in the most recent pay round. We will offer more focussed consultation with members, exploring a window within which the final offer will land, developed using robust analysis and setting this out in a more concise employers' statement.

There was, however, a minority of employers that supported structural reform to the negotiating process, and conditions for this reform may become more favourable in the future. Therefore,

UCEA is committing to review the proposed approach to pay bargaining in three to four years to assess the adapted approach to negotiations within New JNCHES.

We are also exploring some potential improvements to the current New JNCHES system, such as simplifying how we ratify decisions and streamlining the disputes procedure, although these changes would require agreement with the trade unions.

Employment policy

Government announces removal of controversial "sunset clause" in Retained EU Law Bill and introduction of rolled-up holiday pay

On 10 May 2023, the Westminster Government published its paper, 'Smarter Regulation to Grow the Economy'. The paper sets out proposed changes to regulations, aimed at reducing bureaucracy and driving economic growth. Of particular interest to members are the proposed changes affecting retained EU law and the Working Time Regulations 1998. Changes to limit non-compete agreements to three months, and Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations 2006 (TUPE) consultation requirements for small employers with fewer than 50 people and transfers affecting less than 10 employees.

The Retained EU Law (Revocation and Reform) Bill sets out proposals regarding which aspects of EU law would be retained and which would be removed following the UK's departure from the EU, and included a "sunset clause." This clause would have led to the majority of retained laws being discarded on 31 December 2023 unless deliberately protected. However, due to growing opposition, the government has now announced that this clause will be removed and replaced with a specific list of the retained EU laws that will be revoked at the end of the year. There is currently no key employment legislation on the list.

We are still awaiting a full response to the government consultation on calculating holiday, entitlement for part-year and irregular workers, which followed the Supreme Court's judgement in Harpur Trust v Brazel (July 2022), but note that the government is proposing the introduction of rolled up holiday pay in law, at the rate of 12.07%. The government also plans to merge the 4 weeks minimum holiday required under the Working Time Directive and the 1.6 weeks required under domestic law (Working Time Regulations), maintaining the same amount of statutory leave entitlement overall, and simplify record keeping requirements.

These proposed changes will be the subject of a **consultation** due to end on 7 July 2023. UCEA will be responding to the section on 'Holiday pay and entitlement reform' on behalf of the HE sector, using the information that was collected in response to the government **consultation** on calculating holiday entitlement for part-year and irregular workers during February and March this year. Acas guidance on mental health

Acas has published **new guidance** on making reasonable adjustments for staff experiencing mental health conditions. While this does not create any new legal obligations, it provides detailed practical guidance for employers and employees, highlighting the importance of creating a supportive and inclusive work environment for those that are experiencing mental health conditions. It includes guidance on:

- How employers should respond proactively and collaboratively to requests for reasonable adjustments in relation to mental health;
- Types of reasonable adjustments to consider for mental health; and
- How to manage ongoing reasonable adjustments through regular review and monitoring.

Guidance for employers – ethnicity pay reporting and positive action in the workplace The Westminster Government has published Ethnicity pay reporting: guidance for employers. The guidance sets out how employers can report on their ethnicity pay and covers how to:

- · collect employees' ethnicity data;
- · gather the required payroll data for ethnicity pay calculations;
- · undertake ethnicity pay calculations;
- · analyse and understand the results of these calculations; and
- · develop an action plan to address any identified disparities.

The aim of the guidance is to develop a consistent, methodological approach to ethnicity pay reporting, which leads to meaningful action, while remaining proportionate and without adding too much burden on employers. Much of the guidance mirrors the approach set out in the government's guidance for gender pay gap reporting to help employers avoid having to run different processes to collect pay data for both sets of calculations.

For further information on gender, ethnicity and intersectional pay gaps please see UCEA's recently published report, Intersectional Pay Gaps in Higher Education and our resources on equality and pay gaps.

In addition to the guidance on ethnicity pay reporting above, the government has also published guidance on **Positive action in the workplace** to help employers understand how they can use the positive action provisions in the Equality Act 2010 (the Act) appropriately to remove barriers to diversity in their workforce and enable equality of opportunity.

The new guidance draws on the Equality and Human Rights Commission's (EHRC) Statutory Code of Practice on Employment (the Statutory Code) which has a section on positive action (chapter 12) and includes a checklist the Statutory Code suggests that employers use to consider and document positive action measures. The guidance recommends that employers read Chapter 12 of the Statutory Code, in addition to the guidance.

Office for Students (OfS) consultation on harassment and sexual misconduct On 23 February 2023 the OfS launched a consultation on a new approach to regulating harassment and sexual misconduct in English HEIs. The consultation closed on 4 May and Universities UK (UUK) submitted a response on behalf of the sector. UUK's response includes feedback on the consultation proposals from UCEA members including on the proposal to introduce a new general ongoing condition of registration relating to harassment and sexual misconduct and a proposal that HE providers should create a 'single document that comprehensively sets out their policies and procedures on subject matter relating to incidents of harassment and sexual misconduct.

The OfS is aiming to publish a summary of the responses and their decisions later this year.

Neonatal leave and parents' redundancy protection bills become law

Three Private Members' Bills relating to parents and unpaid carers which were backed by the Westminster Government received Royal Assent on 25 May 2023. Parents and carers will benefit from the following new provisions, once secondary legislation is in force:

- The Neonatal Care (Leave and Pay) Act: This will provide up to 12 weeks of <u>paid</u> neonatal
 care leave for employed parents whose children are admitted to neonatal care. This is in
 addition to other leave and pay entitlements such as maternity and paternity.
- The Protection from Redundancy (Pregnancy and Family Leave) Act: This will extend
 existing redundancy protection for pregnant women and new parents whilst on Maternity
 Leave, Adoption Leave or Shared Parental Leave to cover pregnancy and a period of time
 after parents return to work.

 The Carer's Leave Act: Employees who are unpaid carers will be entitled to a week of flexible <u>unpaid</u> leave a year if they are caring for a dependant with a long-term care need.

Pensions in HE

UCEA pensions newsletter

In May we published edition 32 of our **pensions newsletter**. This latest edition looked at the pension reforms implemented in France including an increase in the state pension which have led to widespread protests from workers across the country. We also looked at the latest developments in the UK State Pension age review, and provided updates on the main HE sector pension schemes.

Capita data breach

Several high profiles pension schemes and insurers and councils have announced that they have been impacted by the recent Capita data breach. Capita is one of the largest public-sector service providers in the UK. It has £6.5 billion in contracts managing systems such as the BBC licence fee, the London congestion charge and providing administration and technology services to pension schemes and insurance providers.

The cyber-attack involved ransomware where criminals use malware to search through an organisation's systems, stealing vast quantities of data. In most cases, the criminals encrypt the files and lock users out of their devices until a ransom is paid.

Capita says that the cyber-attack was "significantly restricted" and affected only 4% of its IT systems. Over the course of the past month we have heard that the trustees of the Unilever pension scheme have said that they have been affected and have written to their 40000 scheme members to say that personal information was compromised in the hack, while the trustees of the M&S pension scheme and the insurer Rothesay are also said to be affected. Such is the reach of Capita, several councils across England that use the organisations services to support council tax and benefit services have also stated that they are affected by the data breach.

USS also recently **announced** that details of USS members were held on Capita servers and accessed by hackers. The information potentially accessed included title, initial(s), name date of birth, National Insurance number and USS member number. Retirement dates were contained in the files.

The Pensions Regulator has stated that pension scheme trustees are responsible for the security of their members' data. Where schemes are affected by the data breach they should proactively communicate with scheme members to **warn them about pension scams**. Pension trustees should also monitor increased or unusual transfer requests.

Summary of findings

The UCEA Member Satisfaction Survey assesses members' satisfaction with the range of services we currently provide and gains valuable feedback on specific aspects of our work. It is also an important opportunity to assess how our subscribing organisations feel about the quality of UCEA services and our representation of members' interests. A further aim is to gather members' reflections on what they might want to see UCEA develop.

Our latest triennial survey was conducted in April and May of this academic year. With our last survey conducted in January 2020 just prior to the Covid-19 pandemic and all the ongoing and continuing repercussions, and with the amount the sector has been through since then, UCEA is acutely aware that the sector seeks new support in addressing new challenges.

While there is no room for complacency, the findings of this survey demonstrate the value our members place on UCEA's services and activities, helping us to understand what we need to emphasise in order to continue providing the support they need in these difficult times.

Both Heads of Institution and HR Directors were asked to participate in the survey, setting out the future priorities they wished UCEA to address. The survey then delved deeper, asking HR Directors for more feedback on UCEA's success in delivering against our aims and objectives in specific areas. Our thanks go to all contributors.

The information we gathered in the membership survey is extremely valuable, providing us with feedback from three years' service provision during the Covid-19 pandemic and the ongoing unprecedented industrial relations challenges and valuable information to shape our future priorities and services. In the autumn we expect to focus on our strategic direction for the next planning cycle.




Overall satisfaction

Introduction

We have all been dealing with so much uncertainty for some time now. The dramatic effects of Covid-19 could never have been predicted; we all had to respond so swiftly and in unprecedented ways. These dramatic events came on top of significant changes and challenges already facing the higher education (HE) sector: the effects of Brexit, changes to sector finances and pressures on pay and pensions to name a few.

The cumulative effect of the challenges we face are significant, and we will be navigating them for some time. Taken together, they result in a precarious and uncertain landscape ahead.

And this is why we need to be agile. The uncertainty we are all managing requires us to be constantly attuned to the changing environment, predicting developments where possible and responding to changes as comprehensively and swiftly as possible.

In developing Agility in a time of uncertainty, there were a number of principles that UCEA wanted to weave through our plans. Taken together, we believe these principles underpin the approach we want to take in achieving our plans, providing a guide to the way we work.

- We want to be constantly attuned to members' needs, anticipating changes and being swift in our response, providing tailored high quality support.
- We want to be proactive in anticipating the changing external environment and using our insight and expertise to anticipate what that may mean for universities and HE colleges, particularly in their role as employers.
- We will take a collective approach, ensuring we work in collaboration with others where possible; this will involve building and maintaining meaningful relationships based on trust and mutual respect.
- o We want to ensure we capture learning from the past year, where we have had to adapt quickly and take the benefits of new ways of working and blend them with the positives of what went before.
- o We will be as inclusive as possible; reaching into members and having meaningful engagement at many levels, understanding the range of members we have, ensuring our Board reflects the range of organisations we represent, wherever possible, and remaining an inclusive place to work, that understands and values diversity of thought and identity.

UCEA STRATEGIC PLAN APRIL 2021 - SEPTEMBER 2023

These principles constantly attuned to members' needs, proactive in anticipating the changing external environment, taking a collective approach, capture learning from the past year, being as inclusive as possible have helped us in developing our four strategic priorities:

- 1. Promoting constructive employment relations
- 2. Supporting employer aspirations to enhance the employee experience
- 3. Supporting members through our influence and engagement
- Taking forward UCEA in support of our members

These priorities provide a framework to how we organise the key activities that we will pursue over the coming 30 months. We have purposefully developed our strategic plan over a shorter timescale than normal due to the levels of uncertainty that we are all facing. Instead we need a bridging programme of work that would address key pressing priorities.

We will report back on progress to our members and partners at least annually on what we have achieved so far, what we will do next, and where we have had to flex our plans if necessary.

Context and Challenges

While we have been developing our strategy, the United Kingdom (UK) has been in the grip of the Covid-19 pandemic. The changes to how we manage every aspect of our lives have brought specific challenges to the HE sector.

How the sector delivers its core purpose of world class teaching and research has changed dramatically, with remote learning and working for the majority and socially distanced for the rest. Student and staff wellbeing needs have become more acute, with the challenges of self isolating, juggling work and study with caring responsibilities and general increased anxiety.

Remote learning has resulted in some students demanding refunds on rent and fees, higher education institutions (HEIs) are unable to rent out space and there are costs associated with making premises 'Covid secure.' And there have been examples of industrial relations becoming more strained at least locally, with concerns regarding staff safety.

Covid 19 has come when there was already pressure on finances within the sector, exacerbating the situation. The introduction of tuition fees (although not in Scotland) and reduction of public subsidies has resulted in a commercially driven sector, especially with regard to teaching. This has also increased student expectations, putting pressure on the need to invest in estates.

The UK's decision to leave the European Union (EU) which came into effect on 1 January 2021, is also exacerbating financial pressures and causing operational challenges. It is as yet unclear the impact this will have on international student numbers from both the EU and elsewhere, and processing students and staff from the EU is now more complicated.

And financial pressure of course will affect pay. In a context of unprecedented uncertainty, there are both real and perceived problems to maintaining the reputation of HE as a sector of model employers. The last two years have seen industrial relations come under significant strain. The need for pay moderation within the sector will place pressure on pay negotiations and the collective bargaining machinery.

Pensions have traditionally been an important employment benefit for staff in HE but, across the sector, there are continuing complexities in maintaining this element of the reward package. The Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS) has been the subject of repeated industrial action, while the most recent calculations show a sharp rise in its funding deficit due in part to deteriorating market conditions resulting from the impact of Covid 19. HEIs in the public sector pensions schemes would value additional flexibility to manage the costs and risks associated with scheme membership, given the anticipated funding shortfalls in many institutions.

Taken together Covid 19, financial pressures, Brexit, pay and pensions these challenges present unprecedented uncertainty for the HE sector in the years ahead.



1. Promoting constructive employment relations

UCEA wants to work collaboratively with our partners wherever possible. This means building working relationships with the HE trade unions that are based on trust and mutual respect. We believe this will improve not only national but local working relationships too.

As such, we want to negotiate with the unions in a way that reflects this: fairly, with an understanding of different perspectives, and making progress towards an outcome that all can agree with. This may mean alternative models for bargaining something that we feel is worth exploring. It also means collaborating on projects of mutual interest, which will move us towards fair and affordable total reward and an enriching employee experience.

What we will do

- We will work with all our partners, including the HE trade unions, to develop relationships based on mutual trust and respect that foster productive dialogue on a range of issues.
- We will identify opportunities for improved partnership working with unions. This is likely to include systemic pay issues such as how gender and ethnicity intersect to result in pay gaps.
- Building on what we already know, we will develop a deeper and more nuanced understanding of what our members want from collective bargaining, the outcomes they wish to see and how they want it achieved.
- We will work in collaboration with our members and partners to explore possible alternative models for bargaining with the ambition of achieving a fit for purpose method for agreeing pay within the sector that supports our members to be progressive employers.
- We recognise that at times agreement cannot be reached and in such instances, we will prepare for and support members through any disputes and/or industrial action.

When these activities are realised...

Building on the high levels of satisfaction with current UCEA services among members, HEIs will feel supported by UCEA in their role as progressive employers.

Levels of trust and respect between UCEA and our partners will grow.

Many of our relationships with our partners will have improved and there will be two way open and honest dialogue taking place.

We will have more programmes of work operating that seek to achieve outcomes based on mutual interest.

We will measure how successful these activities have been by...

Asking our members about the level of support they have had from us via our flagship triennial membership survey and draw upon other regular contact such as visits to institutions and pulse surveys.

Conducting stakeholder perceptions work, to measure and track the relationships we have with our partners.

Being able to identify joint programmes of work with a range of partners and measuring joint outputs.



2. Supporting employer aspirations to enhance the employee experience

As the representative of HEIs as employers, UCEA can uniquely support our members in enhancing the compact between them as employers and their employees. This is about the holistic experience a member of staff has with their workplace, from total reward to their sense of belonging.

The impetus to do this work was already becoming acute, with increasing diversity in the workforce bringing a broader range of aspirations and expectations of careers among employees. But more than ever, Covid 19 has had a dramatic impact on how we work and the relationship between employers and employees. We want to support members in ensuring people management approaches remain relevant, bringing together expertise to help define and develop good practice.

What we will do

- We will promote discussion among our members and experts on what the 'employee experience' encompasses, the employer role in enhancing it and how a better employee experience can help our members achieve their overall strategic goals.
- We will work with both employers and employees to identify good practice on reward and motivation.
- We will work with our members and partners to articulate the benefits of working within the HE sector.
- We will examine the contribution of the pay spine and other mechanisms to support members' reward strategies, particularly in respect of staff recruitment and retention, addressing pay gaps and recognising individual contribution.

- We will assess the reward implications of the increasing use of defined contribution pension schemes across the sector.
- We will develop our understanding of the needs of employers and employees in relation to pension scheme flexibility and will lobby against any further increases in employer contributions in the 2020 scheme valuations.
- We will support members through the 2020 USS valuation and implementation of any resulting changes, including any potential associated industrial action.
- We will explore the best mechanisms for managing total reward, seeking to deliver fair and affordable outcomes.

When these activities are realised...

We, our members and our partners in the HE sector will have a better understanding of what a good employee experience means.

We and our members will have an improved understanding of what employees expect and value from their reward packages.

We, our members and our partners will have a shared understanding of the benefits of working in HE, which will be clearly articulated and promoted to those working in and outside the sector.

We will measure how successful these activities have been by...

Conducting pulse surveys of our members to complement our triennial membership survey and will build on anecdotal feedback from increased face to face engagement.

Measuring engagement among members with our resources, such as our website, events, and embedding any learning to improve engagement further.



3. Supporting members through our influence and engagement

UCEA is uniquely placed to speak for our members and to make a compelling case for HEIs as progressive employers. We work to be both responsive to emerging needs and proactive at anticipating issues that will be of importance. This involves ensuring our channels for influencing external stakeholders and engaging with members are best in class, bringing together leaders and influencers to share expertise with HEIs and facilitating peer support among members. In doing so, we must of course recognise that decisions affecting HE will be made in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, as well as in Westminster.

What we will do

- Working with members and partners, explore new opportunities to engage them, building on the successful delivery of regular virtual events, networks and meetings to develop channels.
- Working in collaboration with our members and partners to maximise impact and minimise duplication, develop a strategy to influence government across the UK and other key stakeholders, working to ensure our members' needs are understood and reflected.
- Develop a digital strategy to ensure we engage with our members and partners as effectively as possible and that our content is accessed by intended audiences.
- Be both proactive and responsive in our media engagement, ensuring our messages reach a wide audience and working with partners and members to amplify messages where appropriate.
- Develop our thought leadership offer to stimulate thinking in the sector across the latest developments in a wide range of policy matters, in particular supporting members to be progressive employers and demonstrating good practice in this endeavour.

When these activities are realised...

Our content, insights and messages will reach our members and partners through a range of channels and formats.

We will be engaging with members and partners through a range of means, tailoring content and deployment when appropriate.

We will know how members and partners want to be engaged with and be using that insight to inform every communication and engagement opportunity.

We will measure how successful these activities have been by...

Measuring member satisfaction with the engagement they have with us via our flagship membership triennial survey, more regular pulse surveys and visits.

Conducting stakeholder preference work to measure how satisfied our partners are with how we engage with them.

Gathering and analysing feedback from events and other engagement opportunities with members and embedding learning to improve satisfaction with these resources where appropriate.

Measuring engagement among members with our resources, such as our website, events, and embed any learning to improve engagement further.



4. Taking forward UCEA in support of our members

Covid-19 and other recent challenges demonstrate how important it is that we are constantly attuned to members' needs, swift in our response, as well as seeking to anticipate challenges and opportunities, before they have fully materialised.

We want to enhance the already extensive engagement we have with our members, so we understand their needs, and use this insight to develop our member services, ensuring any new areas of work are aligned with our core mission and objectives. We need to do this while remaining financially sustainable, ensuring we are a rewarding place to work for our staff and our governance arrangements are as diverse and inclusive as possible.

What we will do

- We will review our member offer, seeking to improve the use and accessibility of UCEA resources and communications.
- We will undertake regular membership visits (virtual or in person), seeking feedback on our activities and ensuring we provide value for money.
- We will develop new opportunities to further support members through bespoke consultancy work on pay benchmarking or other employment matters.
- We will develop a financial strategy to maintain reserves at an appropriate level having, for 2020 21, frozen subscription fees and run a deficit budget.
- We will develop ways of working for staff that encompass the best of both remote and office working and build on the support we have already offered staff regarding their health and wellbeing by providing renewed opportunities for learning and career development.
- We will monitor our governance and decision making arrangements to ensure UCEA reflects institutional diversity on our Board while maintaining a common approach to lobbying and negotiation.

 We will conduct a Board effectiveness review.
 This will include examining how the Board can be reflective of our membership, improving diversity and seek to identify any unanticipated barriers to participation.

When these activities are realised...

Our members will make better use of our resources because we will have a better understanding of their needs.

Our staff will be more satisfied in their roles because they will be better able to fulfil their potential.

Our Board will be more diverse and more engaged in our work because there will be fewer barriers to participation.

We will measure how successful these activities have been by...

Conducting pulse surveys of our members to complement our triennial membership survey and will build on anecdotal feedback from increased face to face engagement.

Measuring engagement among members with our resources and embedding any learning.

Designing and implementing meaningful mechanisms for staff to provide feedback. This will include a staff survey and continuous feedback through regular face to face engagement.

Capturing and publishing information on the diversity of our Board and putting in place positive actions to improve diversity.
